God's Faithfulness

We all have been experiencing a season of uncertainty and disappointment this year. It may be similar to what the Israelites faced when being told they would not enter the Promised Land. Or when they were finally able to take the land and God shared His unconventional plan for conquering Jericho. In these stories and others, it is apparent that God wants the Israelites to focus less on what they are capable of and more on what God's capable of. Through it all, God's faithfulness was revealed in the journey the Israelites took. This year, Riverside experienced God's faithfulness in a number of ways.

Faithfulness in programming:

Although we had to cancel a few events and adjusted others, children, youth, and adults still heard the gospel preached at Riverside. We are so thankful that another year of memories was made, several lives were changed eternally, and still others were encouraged in their spiritual walk with the Lord.

Faithfulness in guests' groups:

A short break in ministry during the "lock down" days of April and May led to renewed energy, excitement and gratefulness from our many guest groups once we reopened. It was a season of uncertainty for our guest groups. A number of groups canceled but there always seemed to be another family or small church group interested in our open weekends. Parts of November and December were the only months that have been uncharacteristically quiet at Riverside.

Faithfulness in finances:

We are on pace to end the year in better position financially than last year. Many partners in ministry stepped up in June when we when we had a "matching gift" opportunity. In a few short weeks, the \$10,000 match was reached, helping to replace lost income during the shutdown months.

Faithfulness in God's leading:

We have seen God's faithfulness as He has given discernment in balancing the varying regulatory standards and expectations as we tried to make all our guests feel comfortable. In spite of the circumstances we desired to keep Riverside a place for people to get away from the usual pressures of everyday life and reconnect with God, and that has happened.

Faithfulness in change:

We have seen God's faithfulness throughout this period of constant change. In fact, much of this change has been extremely positive for Riverside. We have added four full-time staff members to our team, completed necessary upgrades to our facilities and even added some additional property. We have seen God's faithfulness in the ways He gave additional support in our areas of need. It's humbling to realize that in a period of struggle, God also decided to make it a period of provision.

God's faithfulness is evident throughout history, and Riverside experienced it this year, too. His faithfulness has been our Rock (Psalm 18:2), a foundation that we can stand on (1 Corinthians 3:11). He is the Anchor of our souls (Hebrews 6:19) and a place of refuge in difficult times (Nahum 1:7).

This year may have thrown all your well laid plans to the wind, but God is constant, dependable and FAITHFUL. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever (Hebrews 13:8)." We pray that during this holiday season you are able to recall the moments where God faithfulness provided assurance in a moment of concern, and that His unshakable plan for the future remains at the forefront of your hearts and minds. The house looks great, and we are very excited to have it as a home for our newest staff members. Riverside is grateful to all the people who were involved and contributed to making the purchase of this new home possible. We are praying for comfort for the Neil Stedman family as they enter into the holiday season.

Thankfully we do have replacement cost insurance proceeds to get us started on the rebuild; however, we are planning

to take this "ordained" opportunity to expand the size of Zarephath. It will now include bathroom facilities and other modern amenities. These improvements will increase the overall cost beyond the available insurance proceeds, but, with the help of our partners, it can be accomplished. These improvements will allow us to continue our efforts to create a more comfortable and modern facility that meets the needs of all of our guests. Be on the lookout in the coming months for how you can help.

I pray that in a very short time Riverside's "Zarephath" will be a place much like it was in I Kings 17, where God reveals His power and His plan to those who obey his commands. I recently spoke with a former Riverside camper, currently living in Idaho, who shared how God used Riverside in her childhood to give her hope. With nothing else seemingly right in her life, she always looked forward to that respite from chaos, to bring calm and encouragement. Now at age sixty-eight she still remembers fondly how, in her words, "God used Riverside to save me."




